Dear Sir

I am looking anxiously to hear from you every express that arrives from Austin. Welch is anxious to purchase and I am keeping him back until I ascertain whether you will sell any of the three leagues here; except to the Govt. write me soon and let me know what answer you have received from Gen. Warrum if he does not take it all let me know at what price you will sell off the lower league and how you will divide it Welch will purchase I think the front half of the lower (nos.) league and pay most or all down - there are others - among the number your obedient wishes to settle down in domestic solitude for the balance of his weary pilgrimage in this world of vanities and vexations and endeavor to be useful to society by obeying that portion of the scripture which bids us go forth - multiply and replenish - and if Sterling you should be inclined to rural indulgencies, I think you will be pleased with some of this

your own domain - but if in the
extreme and soon to be settled, and with
good society - but of that enough -

I wish you would examine the
Office and give me what information
you can gain there and elsewhere in relation
to the title and condition of League No. 8.
Milam County East Side of Boonville including
the mouth of Steel Creek in the name of Wm
Fisher - League No 11 next above and
adjoining No. 8. in the name of J. Steel
League No 4 - $\frac{1}{2}$ miles below Fisher in the
name of Enos Hardin - Oblige me by
giving it your earliest leisure - write and
direct to me at this place - put it in
the Post Office at Austin and our
express will bring it up -
