My Dear Sir:

I have received your letter in relation to the tract of land claimed by Macaulay. I have no wish to make any arrangement with Macaulay if he is not the owner of the land. As it is in dispute & you are one of the claimants I would like your permission to cut wood from the land, to be paid for at the rate of 75 cents per cord, when the decision of the Supreme Court shall have fully placed you in possession. My object is to pay for the wood used by the Govt & in any case where a title is established to make an arrangement in advance with the owner - in case of conflicting title to get permission from both contestants. I am buying wood at present from Mr Steiner at the rate of 40 cents.
