Dear Sir. according to

Your instructions. I have taken to
fort Graham a lot of dry goods
and groceries. I have put the dry
goods in the house that Arnala
formerly occupied. which answers
very well for a dwelling and store
My groceries I put in the old sutlers
store. I found the house occupied
by Las Haly, who gave me permission
by ^{or} Sims permission. since I commenced
business in that house. Barrera has ^{been} ~~been~~
possessive ~~of it~~ and claims it as his
property. He left the house some
two months ago. and took out his counter
and shelves and flooring. now if the
property is yours I wish to continue
in the house and will pay you a reason-
able rent. as I have some three thousand dollars
worth of groceries. and have no
other place to store them. besides
I have had to considerable expense in fitting
up the house. at all events I will
keep it till I hear from you
