T. Kimbal about his agency he wants to know from you what to dwo Eubanks wants him to give up his position to him for Evans Let him know what he shall do for he sais that you promised him that you will let him know as he is holding under you - I have colected for you $120^{\underline{00}}$ dolls & will or can Let Pucketts note at ay time Puckett has Lost his other or Last wife All well yours Fraternally
