have it Broke I shall have it in corn
perhaps I shall be down in that quarter
before Long I supose that you will
hear from B. T. Kimbal about his agency
he wants to know from you what to

his position to him for Evans Let him
know what he shall do for he sais
that you promised him that you will
let him know as he is holding under
you - I have colected for you 120⁰⁰
